Alternatives to Household Hazardous Waste Chemicals

general purpose cleaner	1/4 cup borax, 1/4 cup white vinegar, 2 gallons hot water. Stir to dissolve. Use mop or sponge to clean. Alternative products: Murphy's Oil Soap or Citra-Solv.
scouring powder	1 cup baking soda mixed with ¼ cup borax. Dampen sponge and scoop up mixture. Rub on surface. Let "rest" then rinse well. Alternative product - Bon Ami.
Paint thinner	Let paint particles settle, then pour off clear liquid and reuse.
bug sprays/ insecticides	For gardens, use companion planting and Integrated Pest Management. Plant disease resistant seeds. Pour a line of cream of tartar, red chili pepper, paprika or dried peppermint where ants are entering the house.
insect repellant	Do not wear scented products outdoors. Burn citronella candles, punk, or incense. Alternative product - Bite Blocker.

What products should I bring to the Collection?

Look for the words: Caution, Warning, Poison, Corrosive, Toxic, Volatile, Flammable or Danger on the label.

How Do I Dispose of Hazardous Waste?

- What is a unit one unit equals up to 5 gallons of liquid waste or up to 20 pounds of dry waste or a combination.)
- Residents from participating towns may be bring up to 2 units to the Depot at no charge. More than 2 units may be subject to a per unit charge of \$28.50.
- Residents from non-participating towns are subject to a per unit fee and must pay the contractor in cash or by check. (\$28.50/per unit)
- ◆ Keep hazardous waste in original container **DO NOT MIX.** If leaking wrap in plastic bag and place in a separate box.
- Place materials in a secure box.
- Place secured box in trunk or truck bed.
- Remain in your vehicle.
