Only solid waste generated within the district may be disposed of at this facility. Waste from outside the district is prohibited.

HOURS OF OPERATION: Monday - Friday 8:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., Saturday 8:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m.

CLOSED ON THE FOLLOWING HOLIDAYS: New Year’s Day, President’s Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Veteran’s Day, Thanksgiving Day, the afternoon of Christmas Eve, and Christmas Day.

THE FOLLOWING RULES ARE IN EFFECT:

1. **NO SMOKING** in the building or around the recyclable areas.
2. **Children** (under 12 years of age) will **remain in vehicles** when within the building.
3. **No bare feet** allowed.
4. **NO LOITERING.**
5. Vehicle must have a current **NORSWB** decal (available at Town Office).
6. **Corrugated cardboard, newspaper, magazines, tin cans, glass, and plastics** (#1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7) will be placed in designated areas. **Pellet bags** (clean) may be recycled by turning them inside out and placing in the recycling bag containers at Wal-Mart and Hannaford (other plastic bags also – bread, etc.) See Recyclable Materials flyer for specific examples.
7. **ELECTRONICS:** Cell phones, printers, DVD/VCR players, computers, computer mouse/keyboards, laptops, tablets, televisions, desktop monitors, NiCad/lithium-ion/rechargeable batteries are to be placed in the electronics area. Tractor/vehicle batteries are to be placed in designated area. (All subject to change).
8. **Televisions and CRT monitors** will be placed in the Electronics area.
9. All **fluorescent lights and ballasts** – give to Attendant to place in the Hazardous Waste building.
10. **Rigid plastics**, including lawn furniture and kids’ play toys, will be placed in designated area.
11. **Brush** must be 8’ or less in length and placed in designated area.
12. **Wood debris** must be 4’ or less in length, free of any metal bigger than 1” by 1” (nails, staples, spikes, small bolts, and spikes are acceptable). Glass, plastic, and roofing material must also be removed.
13. **PRESSURE TREATED WOOD** goes in the wood debris pile, and the same rules apply.
14. **Scrap metal and appliances** will be disposed of in the designated areas. Doors must be removed from refrigerators and freezers. No junk cars or major car parts accepted.
15. **Propane tanks and cylinders** must be disposed of in the designated area - see Attendant.
16. **Leaf, garden, and yard wastes** will be placed in the designated area and removed from bags.
17. **PAINT:** Architectural paints, stains, etc. are accepted for recycling through the PaintCare program.
18. **HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE** (materials listed as corrosive or toxic) will be accepted only during the annual Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Collection period.
19. **TIRES** will be charged according to the following FEE SCHEDULE:
 - Passenger and pick-up truck tires..... \$1.00 per tire
 - Dump truck and wheeler tires..... \$5.00 per tire
20. **Fireworks** containers (used) must be soaked down with water and discarded in the trash hopper. Unused fireworks may be brought to the Fire or Police stations.
21. **Used clothing and shoes** can be placed in plastic bags and dropped in the Apparel Impact clothing bins located at the transfer station.
